The good news: Sustainability has become a key policy aim. The bad news: At the moment, it is often difficult for public procurement to meet sustainability criteria in practice. In many cases, it isn't yet possible to reconcile economic, environmental and social welfare aims, even though the government is a major consumer of goods: Government procurement accounts for an estimated 13% of gross domestic product. Each year, the Federal Ministry of the Interior Procurement Office alone buys goods and services worth more than €1 billion. We need to take advantage of this market influence!

With this in mind, the Competence Centre for Sustainable Procurement (KNB) was set up at the Procurement Office of the Federal Ministry of the Interior. The KNB primary task is to inform federal, state and local procurement offices about sustainable public procurement, for example by offering expert advice via its telephone hotline or e-mail, or by providing tailored in-house seminars. The KNB experts also serve on numerous committees devoted to sustainability issues.

In addition to procurement offices and government agencies, the KNB also works with experts from industry, non-governmental organizations and the research community. It hopes to bring all these actors together in order to develop joint solutions of sustainable procurement.
